Did you know?

Blood clots, which form in the deep veins of the body, occur in at least 300,000 people in the U.S. each year and kill nearly one-third of those affected. Many blood clots and deaths can be prevented.

Unfortunately, current public awareness about clotting is extremely low—only about 6 percent of people know the symptoms of a clot and how it can be prevented. The Clot Connect project is designed to meet the need for improved education.

The Clot Connect Project

Clot Connect is a collaborative outreach project led by the University of North Carolina Blood Clot Outreach Program. Clot Connect engages community partners to develop and deliver blood clot education programs for both patients and health care professionals.

Educational initiatives are targeted at:

- Persons who have experienced a blood clot
- Persons at high risk for developing a blood clot
- Health care professionals

Among the initiatives under development are:

- A website providing printable education handouts
- A blog reviewing the latest research and providing answers to commonly asked patient questions
- A webinar series designed to educate newly diagnosed patients
- Printed bookmarks and educational brochures
